

BDL's dialog with PRM | Matching the interests of airlines and airports with those of passengers with reduced mobility | How to get an understanding of an accessible aviation

Presentation abstract

Beneath others the Bundesverband der Deutschen Luftverkehrswirtschaft (BDL, engl. German Aviation Association) is representing the interests of German airport and airline operators. The operators have to handle with passengers with reduced mobility (PRM), especially regarding Regulation (EC) No 1107/2006. BDL initiated a dialog platform for its members and PRM lobby groups. These representatives are called by the Deutscher Behindertenrat (dbr, engl. German Council for the Disabled) and the Bundesarbeitsgemeinschaft der Senioren-Organisationen e.V. (BAGSO, engl. German National Association of Senior Citizens' Organisations). Since 2015 BDL is inviting twice a year to a dialog between operators and those passengers representatives. They share information concerning services, design, safety and security issues (e.g. limitations, rescue procedures, security searches), intermodal passenger transport, researches etc. Depending on the focused topic, BDL is inviting third parties, like administration, design and production organisations, other traffic/ transport operators etc. The dialogs are helping every participant to get a better understanding of each other and to forward the shared information to the companies and PRM community.
